





Alfred Wallis: KS2 Knowledge Mat

Subject Specific Vocabulary

Elements	The building blocks of artwork, eg. lines, shapes, form, space, texture, value, colour.
Composition	The plan or placement of elements in an artwork.
Expression	Showing your ideas through artwork.
Inspiration	Something that moves an artist to create art.
Tool	An item that an artist uses to create with, eg. pencil, brush, pen, crayon
Mark-making	Using tools to create lines, patterns, textures and shapes.
Line	The line or shading used to show the outside edge of a figure or an object.

- Alfred Wallis lived in Cornwall from 18th August 1855 – 29 August 1942.
- He was a fisherman, who later on had a rag and bone store. After he retired, he took on odd jobs, including selling ice-cream.
- Alfred Wallis took up painting because he was lonely when his wife died in 1925.

Red, blue and yellow are the primary colours. They are used to make other colours.


Value
